A. Introduction

In order for the results of this test to be accurate the following points must be heeded.

1. You must have a sane and sober estimation of your capabilities.

- 2. Don't overate or underrate yourself.
- 3. Be 100% HONEST with your answers.

4. Don't try and read into the question what results a yes or a no answer will produce and hence manipulate your results. If you do this won't get a truthful result and will not really discover your true motivational gifts. In short you'll be the loser.

5. Each question must be read through once or twice till **clearly understood** and then **immediately answered according to your first impression** which more than likely will be the correct answer. If you think about it too long you will tend to manipulate the answers.

6. You may find that you do not definitely know the answer to some questions because you have not been through that experience. Answer those questions from the impression you have inside of yourself - how you soberly and honestly think you would handle that situation.

Maybe you will get a clue to the answer to that question by relating it to a similar **secular** situation that you have been through?

7. Pray before you do this test and ask the Holy Spirit to help you answer the questions correctly according to your motivations, so that through this test your true motivational gifts will be discovered.

(The lecturer must read out each question, explain it if anyone doesn't understand, give the students about 15 to 20 seconds to answer, and proceed with the next question.)

B. Motivational Gift Test.

Either circle YES or NO for each question.

- 1. YES/NO Would you describe yourself as an effective public speaker?
- **2.** YES/NO Do you find it relatively **easy and enjoyable** to spend time in **intense study** and research of the bible?
- 3. YES/NO Do you enjoy sharing the personal and emotional problems of people?

- 5. YES/NO Do you seem to concentrate more on practical things that need to be done, rather than on why they should be done?
- 6. YES/NO Would you rather give money to help than perform some manual task?

- C. How did the motivational gifts operate in the life of Jesus?

John 3:34 (NASB) "For He whom God has sent speaks the words of God, for He gives the Spirit without measure."

34 (Moffatt) "...God gives Him the Spirit in no sparing measure."

Because Jesus has a **full anointing** of the Holy Spirit, He had all 9 gifts of the Holy Spirit (*1 Cor 12:8-10*), all 5 ministry gifts (*Eph 4:11*) and also the 7 motivational gifts (*Rom 12:6-8*) operating perfectly in His life.

Here we see Jesus operating perfectly in each of the **7 motivational gifts** as each different situation required.

- 1. Prophet in *Luke 5:21-22 & Mark 6:4*
- 2. Teacher in *Luke 4:31-32 & Matt 5:2*
- 3. Exhorter in *Luke 8:50 & John 8:3-11*
- 4. Ruler in *Mark 6:39-45 & John 6:12*
- 5. Servant in John 13:3-17 & Mark 10:45
- 6. Giver in John 10:28 & Matt 16:19
- 7. As a Mercy person in Luke 7:13 & Matt 9:36

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Using a Chalk Board is a great asset in eliminating confusion while explaining how to mark this test.

- 1. Once completed, get the students to put the letter "G" for GOLF to the left of # 7. (i.e. G 7. YES/NO).
- 2. Now put the same "G" next to all multiples of seven, (i.e. G 14.; G 21.; etc., right up to G 63.).
- Now left of 1 to 6 fill in A, B, C, D, E, F respectively, and do the same with the rest of the sheet, i.e. 8 to 13, 15 to 20, etc.
- 4. Now count all the "YES's" you have for all the "A's" and record your score under "POINTS OBTAINED". Do not count the "NO's".
- 5. Do the same with all the **B**'s, **C**'s, etc.
- 6. Now under the heading of "MOTIVATIONAL GIFT" record the following:-
 - A Prophet
 - B Teacher
 - C Exhorter
 - D Ruler
